The City of Irvine mission statement identifies the City as a "community where people can live, work and play." The Community Services Department is proud of its role in creating and maintaining play-spaces and offering programs to get the community out into the parks and playing ... it's what we do!

The City of Irvine maintains 51 parks, 55 playgrounds, and 479.8 acres of parks. Irvine has about 1 acre of City parks and play-spaces for every 436 residents. Our Activity Guide offers more than 1,500 programs and activities for the community.
