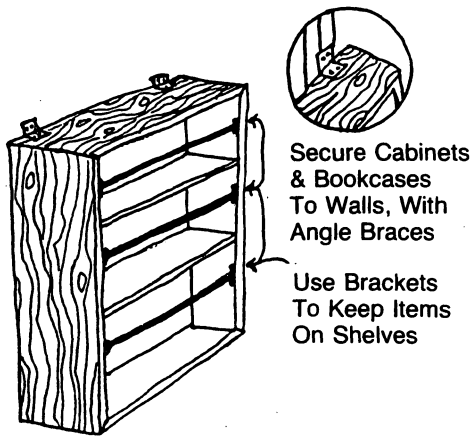
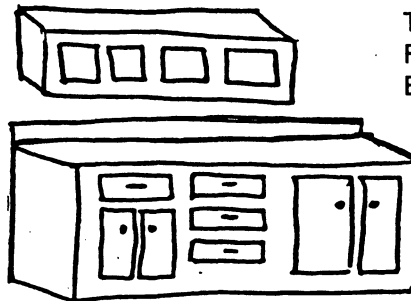

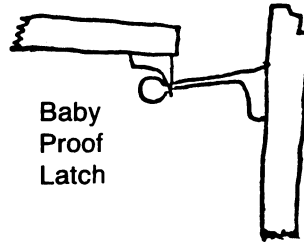
Secure Cabinets & Bookcases To Walls, With Angle Braces

To Protect Food, Dishes Etc.

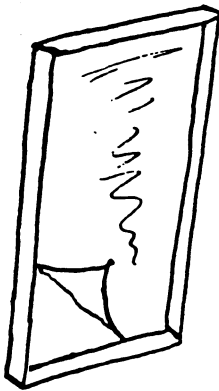
Secure Cupboard Doors & Drawers With Latches



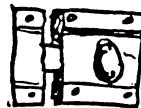

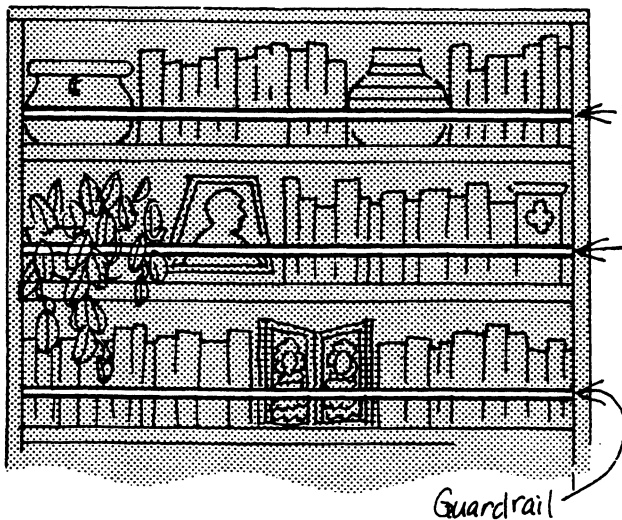
Home Hazard Safety at a Glance



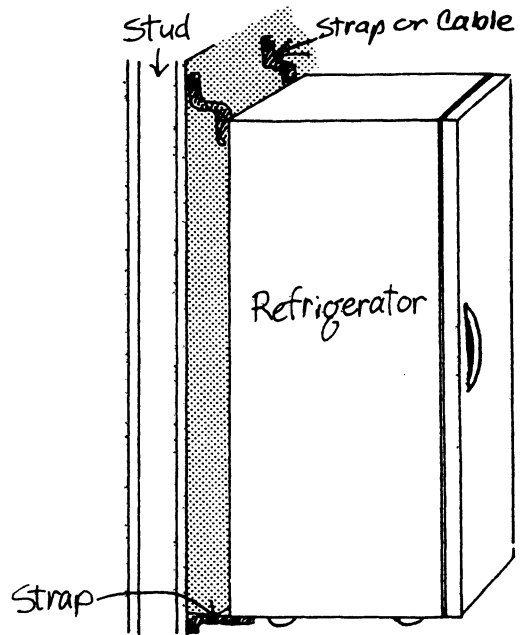
Anchor your hot water heater to wood studs.
