Burglars often choose the garage door to gain entry to a home because it is usually the weakest, and therefore the easiest, point of entry. Once inside, burglars know to look for electronic devices and other belongings. Becoming a burglary victim can leave a family feeling vulnerable and violated.

REDUCE THE RISK OF BECOMING A VICTIM

Whether you are home or not, close and lock your garage door if you are not present. It only takes a moment for a thief to make off with valuable property.

- \bigstar Lock all doors leading into your garage.
- \bigstar Make it a habit to remove valuables from plain **sight.** Lock car doors even when the garage is closed.
- Keep garage door openers on key rings. Do not \bigstar leave them inside the car.
- When purchasing a remote opener, consider one with a "rolling code". The changing code will prevent thieves from being able to use a captured code to open the door.
- **Lock bicycles even inside the garage.** Use as much of the bicycle in the lock as possible, not just the front wheel.
- Register your bicycles with the Irvine Department.
- Inventory your belongings. Use photographs and record model and serial numbers.
- Change door locks when moving into a new residence. Previous owners and tenants may not have kept track of their keys.
- Look out for your neighbors. Notify your neighbors if they leave their garage door open.
- Report suspicious behavior immediately. Call 949-724-7200 or download and use the Crime Tip feature on our Access Irvine app.
